ormed as a commercial painting company in 1986, Southwest Companies has grown and diversified to encompass services for an entire building envelope. We took many classes to learn about interior and exterior envelopes of buildings, and how to waterproof and maintain them. Building upkeep and maintenance is more than just a paint job."
